





The National Center for Rural Road Safety had its second Rural Road Safety Awareness Week this past Monday through Friday. Graphic from the National Center for Rural Road Safety Facebook page. OSWEGO - Friday brought a close to the National Center for Rural Road Safety's Rural Road Safety Awareness Week (RRSAW), the second campaign to mitigate serious injuries. RRSAW started this past Monday, July 19 and this year's theme, according to the National Center for Rural Road Safety, was "Live, Work and Explore along the Rural Road to Zero." This zero that is mentioned is part of the center's overall goal of bringing rural road fatalities and serious injuries to "zero." In order to do this, it is critical for drivers to slow down and follow good driving practices, even if there is nobody else on the road. "I think some people may have a tendency to drive faster if they are in a rural setting. Speed is one of the top causes of accidents. The greater the speed the shorter the reaction time," Oswego Police Chief Phil Cady said. "Slow down and give yourself time, overall, speeding doesn't get you there any faster. Wear your seatbelt and make sure everyone in the vehicle is also wearing it."

Beyond slowing down and wearing a seatbelt. Cady added that people should

and Community Leaders of Ame ca (FCCLA) to ic safety. FCCLA 2021-2022 1st Place gran Three Forks High School is an organization for students in amily and Consumer Sciences education through grade 12. There are 65 chapters across Montana. Teen drivers represent approximately 10% of all fatalities and 22% of Montana's total serious injuries, yet teens only account for approximately 6.7% of the state's population. As part of the Vision Zero goal, MDT has made this issue a priority by continuing partnerships with organizations like FCCLA.

To help fund this project, MDT successfully applied for a \$18,000 grant through Ford Driving Skills for Life (Ford DSFL) a grant tied to teen speeding issues. Local FCCLA chapters that completed an application and scored well during the ranktrue completes an approximon and accreted werd ourning the rank-ing part of the process received grant funds to support their traffic safety projects. Ford DSFL funding was then distributed to server chaptions throughout the sate, ranging in amounta from \$340 to \$750. These chapters also received National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) funds ranging om \$300 to \$3,750, making the total funding awarded 515,930. As in past years, the grant budgeted prize award money that went to the chapters with the best projects. The 2021/2022 school year grant prizes were awarded as follows:

 1st Place – Three Forks High School (\$2,500) 2nd Place – Medicine Lake (\$1,500)

Prizes were awarded during the Statewide Leadership onference held in March. MDT was also able to award \$1,000 to the other four participating chapters for their efforts. MDT is excited to continue this partnership for the




